GENERAL ORDER 20-11

This Court issues this General Order in response to the recent outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in Trumbull County and throughout the State of Ohio. There are multiple confirmed cases of COVID-19, in response to which the Governor of the State of Ohio, Michael DeWine, has declared an extended state of emergency which, among other things, limits large gatherings. The Governor's Declaration follows the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") "Interim Guidance", recommending that all employers consider how best to decrease the spread of COVID-19, including the review of guidance from state and local health officials.

Given the spike in outbreak of cases of COVID-19 in this County as well as throughout the State of Ohio and the severity of risk posed to the public, and given the CDC mandate and the Governor's Declaration, it is hereby ORDERED that, effective November 30, 2020:

1. Due to the closing of the Solace Center for in-person supervised visitation, the use of Someplace Safe / Solace Center for supervised visitation sessions for Trumbull County Domestic Relations / Juvenile Division cases is SUSPENDED UNTIL FURTHER ORDER OF THIS COURT.



3. This Order is in effect for the following domestic division case numbers: 2017 DR 00222; 2018 DR 00240; 2014 DR 00481; 2018 DS 00310; 2019 DV 00104; 2019 DR 00451; 2019 DS 00038; 2020 DR 00201; 2019 DR 00323; and 2010 DR 00077.


4. The parties shall have their companionship / visitation there by telephonic visitation, via FaceTime, Skype, Zoom, or other video / telephonic media or application available through the Solace Center / Someplace Safe. If that is not available, telephonic is acceptable. The Solace Center / Someplace Safe shall initiate the visit(s) and parties shall aid in said conference(s). Conference(s) shall commence and continue for a reasonable length of time appropriate for the child(ren)'s age(s). Parties shall act and cooperate with each other in a civilized and polite manner to facilitate these companionship / visitation sessions.

5. This Order shall be docketed in each of the above-referenced cases and the Clerk shall issue notice to all parties and counsel in each case.

All until further Order of the Court. IT IS SO ORDERED.
